Thank you once again to all, together, we are fostering a sense of belonging in our community, making a difference in the lives of families one step at a time.

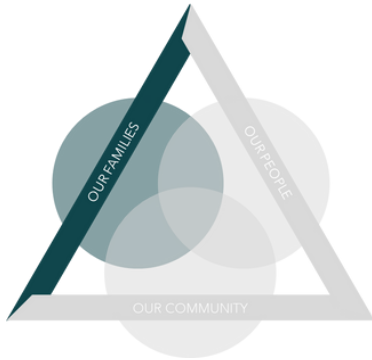

Strategic Plan 2022-2025

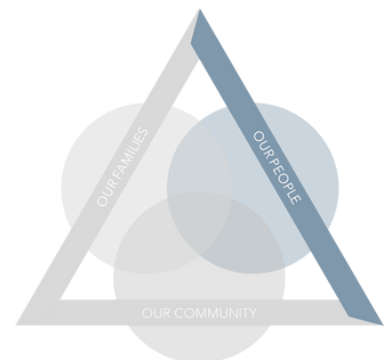

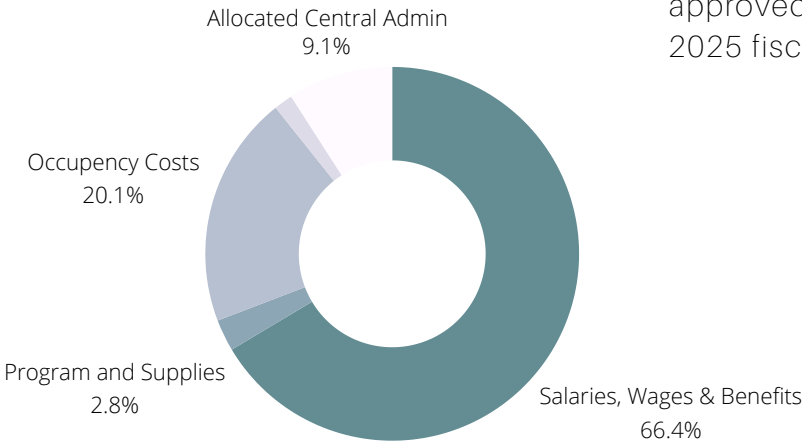
Again, a big thank you to Dave Anderson, CPA, CGA, for his expertise and support in the financial matters of the agency.

A service contract was signed for the 2024 calendar year with a small increase to help with increase pressures in administration costs such as the audit and IT costs.

The following financial activities were completed this past year:

- Exited our Orillia Lease and signed a new lease for our new Orillia location at 250 West St N with a small increase.
- March 2024 - packed and moved the Orillia location, therefore added costs of move and new materials, some of which was supported by the County of Simcoe with a one time grant.

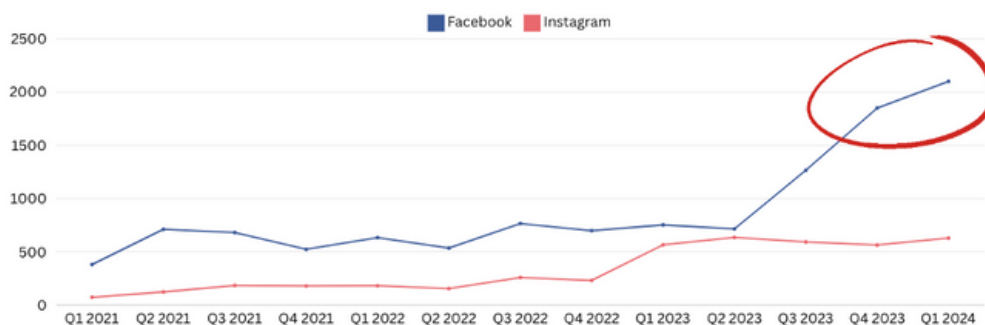

CULTURAL COMPETENCE

VOLUNTEER REPORT

From April 2023 to March 2024 the EarlyON Simcoe North was able to welcome three Georgian College Students into our locations (2 in Orillia, 1 in Midland) for in-person programming. The Midland student also did regular volunteering, providing us with a total of 672 hours of volunteer hours, before heading off to her new job. The Orillia students did approximately 280 volunteer hours each. We were extremely lucky to have our dedicated Board of Directors assist our Executive Director. They provided us with extra energy and vitality; priceless expertise and new insights. They helped to spread the word in their own circles about the resources and services we were able to support the community with.

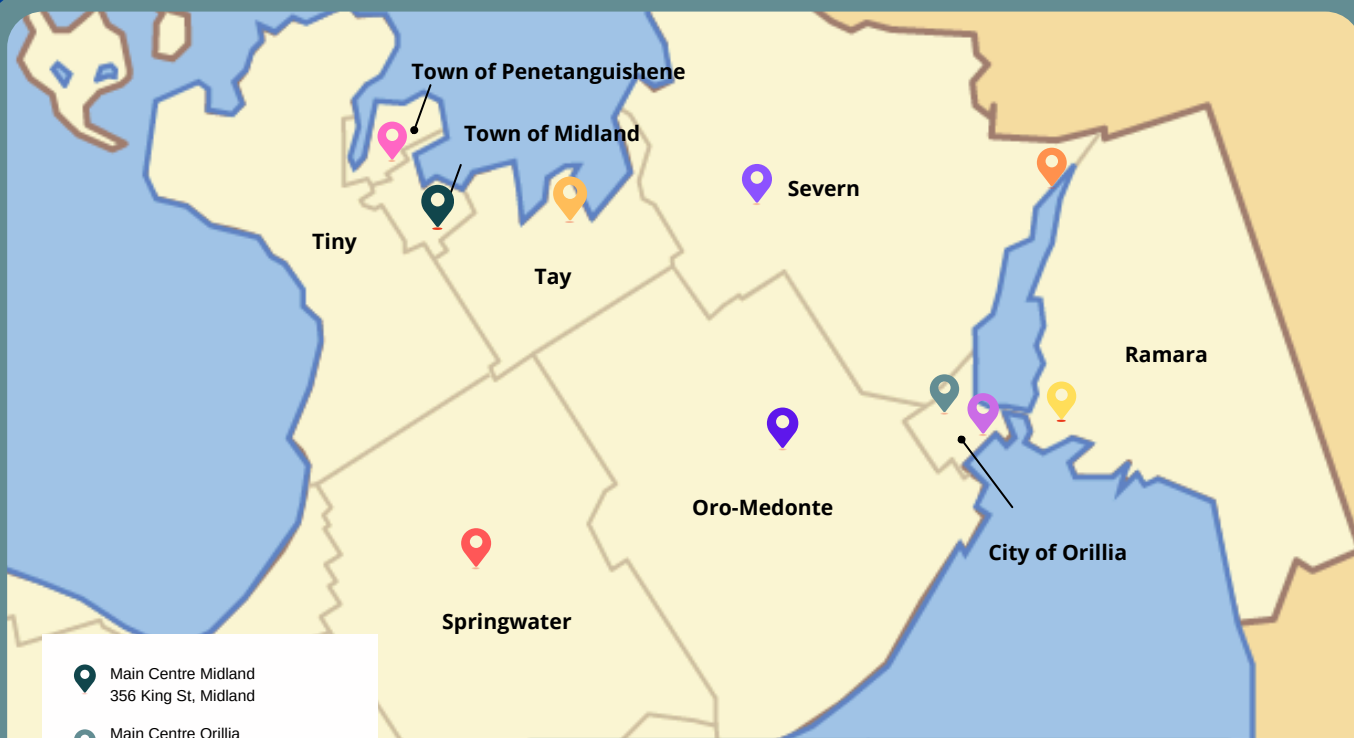

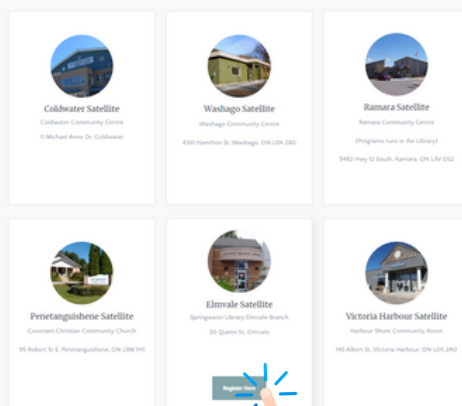

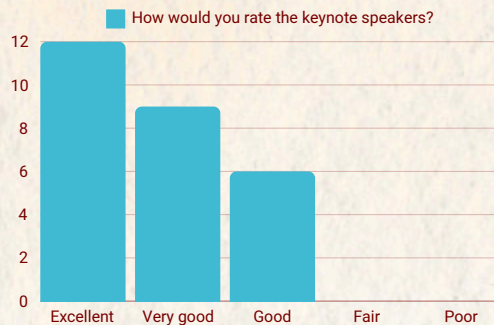
